"and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace."

Read: Ephesians 6:10-15
Getting Started:
1) Flip Flops, Slippers, Sneakers or? Argue your case.
2) Name different kinds of shoes designed for different jobs or activities?
Digging Deeper:
3) Paul seems to be alluding to Isaiah 52:3-7. Read the passage and compare it with the other place Paul cites it (Romans 10:14-15). In light of these passages, what do you think Paul is saying in Ephesians 6:15? Try putting it in your own words.
4) In the ancient world, the word "gospel" (<i>the evangel</i>) sometimes referred to the good news that some horrible war was over. It was communicated through a messenger (<i>an evangelist</i>) who made his way as quickly as he could through dangerous lands to deliver the message.
a) What might make this kind of news time-sensitive?
b) Why were good shoes necessary?
c) How would the mission be dangerous?
d) How is this like the believer shoed with the gospel of peace?
5) Every believer is shoed with the "readiness" to share the gospel with people.
a) What reasons do Christians give for not being ready?
b) How would you respond to these reasons?
c) What do you struggle with the most in sharing your faith?
d) Is that reluctance just a "flesh and blood" struggle? Why or why not?
6) Here are some tips reminders to help you get over your fears: Remind yourself

- The power of the message is greater than all of your weaknesses as the messenger. Discuss.
- The worst you'll probably experience is awkwardness. Other Christians have suffered far worse sharing Christ. Discuss.
- You start with questions rather than statements.

When someone brings up a topic that is spiritual, don't start out declaring, "your wrong and here's the truth!" Instead, ask questions like, that's really interesting, what do you mean by that? And how did you come to that conclusion? If God provides an opportunity, share the truth in a humble way. Discuss why is this better than just making statements, and spend some time thinking of some possible conversations situations.

• People are very receptive to an invitation to church. Become an inviter!
