" And he said to them, "When you pray, say:

"Father, hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come.
Give us each day our daily bread,
and forgive us our sins,
for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us.
And lead us not into temptation."

Adore"hallowed be your name."
Anticipate"Your kingdom come."
Ask
Admit "and forgive us our sins, for we forgive everyone who is indebted to us."
Advance "And lead us not into temptation."

Getting Started - What are some prayers you recited as a kid?

Read Luke 11:1-4 and recite Matthew 6:9-13 together.

- **1)** In verse 2, Jesus says "When you pray, say..." and then recites what has become known as the "Lord's prayer."
 - a) Did Jesus intend for us to say this prayer word for word?
 - b) What's likely to happen if we had no pattern for prayer?
 - c) What's likely to happen if we had only "word for word" prayers?
- **2)** The first part of the prayer focuses us on God's glory and the second part on our needs. Why is this order important?
- 3) Jesus tells us to pray, "Father..."
 - a) How does God become our Father?
 - b) What was God to us before he was our Father?
 - c) What might our prayers be like if we weren't sure of the reality and security of our adoption?
- **4)** Jesus tells us to pray, "Father, hallowed be your name..."
 - a) What does this mean, and why should it be our first request?
 - **b)** Why is it important for believers to approach God both as Father and as God?
- **5)** Jesus tells us to pray, "Your kingdom come." Let's say you lived in North Korea and didn't like it, but you knew that a far better government would seize power in a year's time making everything so much better. Discuss the different ways this coming would change your life. Make application to Jesus' coming (cf. 2 Peter 3:8-13).
- 6) Jesus tells us to pray, "Give us each day our daily bread."
 - a) What might the word "bread" describe for us today?
 - b) Jesus tells us to pray for "daily" bread, not monthly, quarterly, or yearly bread. Why?

- 7) In verse 1, Jesus tells us to pray, "and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us." Matthew says "debts" instead of "sins" (11:4).
 - a) How are sins like debts?
 - b) Why doesn't Jesus instruct us to pray, "Help me to pay my debts"?
 - **c)** If Christians are forgiven "once and for all" for all of the sins we have and will commit, (cf., Rom 5:1; 8:1, 33-34), why should we continue to pray, "Forgive us our sins"?
- 8) Lastly, Jesus tells us to pray, "And lead us not into temptation."
 - a) Is Jesus telling us to pray, "God, please don't tempt us with evil?" Why not (cf. James 1:13-16)?
 - **b)** Compare with 1 Corinthians 10:13 and Ps. 19:12-13 and see if you can come up with an understanding of this request.
 - **c)** Look at a few examples of God keeping people from blowing it (Genesis 20:1-6; 1 Sam.25; 2 Cor. 12:7). How do these examples help you understand Luke 11:4.

9) Divide this prayer among the group. Have a person or two pray about one line each (e.g., 'Sam and Sally, focus on "give us this day our daily bread" part.).
